From the Pastor...

"He will swallow up death forever; and the Lord God will wipe away tears from all faces." Isaiah 25:8

A mother sent her little girl on an errand. The daughter was gone a long time. When she finally returned, her mother demanded an explanation. The little girl explained that on her way she had met a little friend who was crying because she had broken her doll. "Oh," said her mother, "then you stopped to help her fix her doll?" "Oh, no," replied the little girl. "I stopped to help her cry."

All Saints' Day (November 1) reminds us of the day when "God will wipe away every tear from their eyes" (Rev. 7:17). That day is coming but is not yet. Now we live in a vale of tears. We cry over everything from a small disappointment to the death of a loved one. Our tears flow because we live in a broken world, and we ourselves are broken by sin. We are unable to fix our world. We are unable to fix ourselves or those around us. But God is. All Saints' Day not only points us to the day when our tears will stop flowing; it points us to our Lord who comes to fix our broken lives. He comes to cry with us, as He did when Lazarus died (Jn. 11), but more than that, He becomes the One broken on the cross in our place. Yet He did not stay broken. He broke death to pieces by His bodily resurrection. Jesus broke the chokehold of your sin. He broke the power of the devil. You may feel broken, but you're not. Look at your Baptism. You are joined there to your Lord. He gives His risen life to you. He puts His Spirit in you. He forgives you of your sin. He heals your brokenness. In this life the tears will continue to flow, but as we cry with each other, we can also give hope to each other - the hope we have as God's saints through Jesus.

Meet Our Organist!

Hello! My name is Jordan Glock, and I am thrilled to be playing the organ here at Christ Lutheran, Augusta. I grew up in Central Illinois, where my father, who is an LCMS pastor, serves a dual parish. I was introduced to the organ when I was about 8 years old, and I played my first ever Saturday evening church service in August 2007 at the age of 13. In 2008 the congregation decided that I could play every Sunday, and twice a month at the other church where my dad serves. In 2010 I became the organist at every service at both churches up through my first couple years of Junior College. In 2015 I enrolled at Concordia University, Wisconsin, where I graduated in 2018 with a Bachelor's Degree in parish music and a minor in theology. I returned to Central Illinois after college and played for several other LCMS churches in the area, gaining experience in working with other pastors and congregations. In addition to playing here, I am the Director of Traditional Music at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Wentzville, playing the organ and leading the vocal and handbell choirs. It is an absolute pleasure to be here with you in Augusta, and I pray that you may be blessed as we make a joyful noise to the Lord!

Meditation

"The one who endures to the end will be saved." Mark 13:13

Jesus is the one who endured to the end. But He did this for you. So you have a Savior who helps you endure. He does not tell us, "The one who has never been knocked down will be saved," but "*The one who endures.*" We fall down all the time. Our sins lay us flat. The devil tempts us and we give in to the world's charms. We're a mess. We're weak. How will you endure? Through Jesus who keeps lifting you up. He returns you to your Baptism. He draws you to His house of mercy; to His table of grace. He puts His words of life into your ears. Through these, He is laying hold of you so you endure.

"He who endures to the end." You and I will not waltz into heaven. It's more like we'll be carried there on a stretcher by Jesus...bruised, beaten, exhausted...because we're in the fight of our lives and no Christian comes through unscathed. But Jesus is for you. He fought for you, and He fights alongside of you. Lean on Him. Fall into His arms. They are strong, and they are always full of mercy and forgiveness for you. That's how you will endure to the end--through Jesus.

Lord Jesus, if I am to be saved; if I am to endure to the end, it must be You who saves me; You who keeps me enduring. Stay with me always. Forgive me. Strengthen my faith. Keep me in Your Word. Amen.
