## *From the Pastor...*

A mother sent her little girl on an errand. The daughter was gone a long time. When she finally returned, her mother demanded an explanation. The little girl explained that on her way she had met a little friend who was crying because she had broken her doll. "Oh," said her mother, "then you stopped to help her fix her doll?" "Oh, no," replied the little girl. "I stopped to help her cry."

On All Saints' Day (Nov. 1) we are reminded in Revelation 7:17 that "God will wipe away every tear from their eyes." That day is coming, but is not yet. Now we live in a vale of tears. We cry over everything from a disappointment to the death of a loved one. Our tears flow because we live in a broken world, and we ourselves are broken by sin. We are unable to fix our world. We are unable to fix ourselves or those around us. But God is. All Saints' Day not only points us to the day when our tears will stop flowing; it points us to our Lord who comes to "fix" our broken lives. He comes to cry with us, as He did when Lazarus died (Jn. 11), but more than that, He becomes the One broken on the cross in our place. But He did not stay broken. He broke death to pieces by His bodily resurrection. Jesus broke the chokehold of your sin. He broke the power of the devil. You may feel broken, but you're not. Look at your Baptism. You are joined there to your Lord. He gives His risen life to you. He puts His Spirit in you. He forgives you of your sin. He heals your brokenness. In this life the tears will continue to flow, but as we cry with each other, we can also give hope to each other - the hope we have as God's saints through Jesus.

### Additional Voters Meeting News

- ⇒ **The proposed 2017 Budget** was presented, discussed, and passed.
- ⇒ **Augusta Elementary PTO:** Voters approved the donation of two 2017 Sausage Dinner tickets to the PTO Dinner Auction to be placed in a basket with other church sponsored dinners in town.
- ⇒ **Synod Constitution Amendments;** The amendments were announced. We will vote on them in the January meeting.
- ⇒ **Hurricane Relief:** An appeal was presented from Lutheran World Relief for aid for the people in Haiti. We anticipate there may be more requests for domestic relief. Motion carried to authorize the Church Council to act on these as they see fit up to a maximum of \$500 in association with a door collection, half for out of country relief and half for domestic relief.



### Luker Gift

The Luker Family, former members and pastor from prior years, generously presented our congregation a \$25,000 cash gift to be used as we choose. The Trustees are compiling a list of items and/or projects which we may choose to endorse. In the meantime, a motion passed to use \$17,000 to pay down our Line of Credit at First Bank, and \$8,000 to move into the “Memorials and Gifts” and “Building and Improvements” funds for the designated gifts we have already spent for general expenses until such time designations are made as to how they are to be used. A letter is to be sent to those families having gifts on account reminding them of the status of their gift and asking if a designation would want to be assigned.
